

Stage II Restrictions Still in Effect in Much of South Central Montana

Despite the cooler fall weather, the continuing drought is still cause for extreme fire danger in much of south central Montana. **Stage II Fire Restrictions remain in effect on private, state and most federal lands in Big Horn, Carbon, Musselshell, Stillwater, Sweet Grass, Treasure and Yellowstone counties.**

In addition, the areas generally known as the South Hills near Billings, the Shepherd Ah-Nei area north of Shepherd, and the Acton area northeast of Billings are still closed to motorized vehicles. However, fire restrictions in the Beartooth District of the Custer National Forest were rescinded September 23.

When working and recreating outdoors, please continue to use caution and honor restrictions to decrease the chance of more human-caused fires and avoid resource and property damage. Anyone who causes a wildland fire intentionally or through negligence may be held accountable for damage and suppression costs.

Stage II restrictions prohibit any open burning, including campfires. Smoking is allowed only within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials. In addition, motorized vehicles must stay on designated roads and trails, and operating a chainsaw or other equipment powered by an internal combustion engine, blasting or welding is prohibited between 1 p.m. and 1 a.m.

Exemptions are allowed for persons using a fire solely fueled by liquid petroleum or LPG; for a federal, state, or local officer, or member of an organized law enforcement, rescue, or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty; or for persons with a permit or written authorization allowing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
